 Will & Testament; that is to say, principally & first of all
 I Give & Recommend my soul to the hand of Almighty God
 that Gave it; and my body I recommend to the earth to be
 buried in decent manner at the discretion of my Executor
 Nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall
 Receive the same again, by the mighty power of God, and
 as Touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased
 God to bless me in this life, I Give Demise, & Dispose of
 the same in the following manner & form
 First & all I constitute make & ordain Christopher my
 dearly beloved son the sole Executor of this my last Will
 and Testament all & singular my Lands inclosures and
 tenements by him freely to be possessed & enjoyed that
 the Condition that he the said Christopher maintain
 & take good care of me & my wife Mary during both our
 lives, and I do here by utterly disallow, Revoke and disannul
 all and every other former Testaments, Wills legacies, bequests
 & Executors by me in any wise before named made & begun
 & ratifying & confirming this & on other to be
 my last Will & Testament in Witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand & seal this 24th January in the
 year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ten
 Signed sealed published pronounced & declared
 by the said Dabney Harris as his last Will and
 Testament in presence of us

First I Give & bequeath unto my Dearly beloved Wife Elizabeth the one third of all my inheritance after all my Just Debts is paid the Remainding to be equally Divided among my Children Namely Beginning at William then Mathey & one Now being in the Womb & if any of them dying in minority their share is to go to the succeeding heirs I appoint my Wife to be Executrix & William Summers & Richard Summers to be Executors whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 18th Day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & ten
