have bargained, sold and delivered and by these presents
do bargain sell and deliver, to Col. William Edmonston and
Thomas Edmonston one negro man named Amos supposed
to be aged thirty five years, one negress woman named
Barbara twenty two years old and one negro man child
named Peter aged one year two road waggons and nine
horses, to wit two saddles, one team horse four black
horses, one small team horse, and one small stall,
also three other saddle horses to wit two bays and
one brown horse, one Tierce of Gin supposed to
contain sixty seven Gallons, four Barrels of Corn
brandy, containing thirty two Gallons each, two Casks
of Delph ware, two boxes containing three Shovels
eighty falling axes one broad ad axe set of
plough irons eighteen Mallocks thirty three wedding
hoes forty four bars of lead and sundry other
Articles one box shoes, one box hats, one box
chairs two boxes of Delph and China, two
trunks of broad cloth, Linen, Calico, Cassimer,
Muslin, handkerchiefs cotton and silk one box hard
ware Cullery two Stills one containing one hundred
and thirty gallons, one of one thousand and three
Gallons two boxes glass one box mustard all
dry goods in our possession to the said Col. William
Edmonston and Thomas Edmonston to their sole
use and benefit, and the said David and Samuel
do warrant for themselves their heirs & warrant and
defend also by these presents do warrant and defend the
said goods wares and merchandizes to the said
William and Thomas their heirs executors administrators
and assigns against the claims or claims of them

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the said David V. Sonnet their heirs &c. and one of all other
persons whatsoever. In testimony of which we have hereunto
set our hands and seals this 22nd day of March 1798 and
the 22nd year of the Commonwealth.

for values received and for myself and my heirs and assigns
do warrant and defend the said waggon & team from all persons
whatsoever claiming the same James Garner under my hand and
Seal this 20th day of October 1797.

The Condition of the above bill of Sale is such that
if I the said Jonas Garner do pay or cause to be paid
unto the said Jacob Moore the sum of one hundred
dollars fully doleant to be paid at or upon the first day
of December in the year one thousand seven hundred and
ninety seven and fifty dollars to be paid at or upon the
first day of January in the year one thousand seven
hundred
