First I give and bequeath to my son Patrick after my death the plantation wherein I now live being the middle division of that tract of land called the Royal Oak to him and his heirs and assigns so long and to hold forever whereunto my wife Mary the third part of said land ^{By the 10th the West end of the said land} under the trees and cellar.

I also allow to my daughter Martha one horse or mare of the value of fifteen pounds specie and a new saddle. I also ^{give} ~~allow~~ to my son James the negro girl for which he has a bill of sale recorded in the County Court of Washington, also the same horse which is called by the name of Sally. To my daughter Sally the horse known by the name of

To my daughter Anne the young fairbreight bay mare and the Chestnut colored filly.

To my son Patrick the horse called Dolphin and her two colts.

The remainder of the horses and all the stock of cattle sheep hogs all utensils and furniture with every of my moveable estate not before named to the legacies I leave in their hands and at the disposal of my loving wife Mary.

And as there are no debts nor incumbrances on my estate but what has been contracted lately by my son Patrick it is my Will and desire that he discharge all and every of them out of his own patrimony.

To my son Patrick I also leave the negro boy called Billy.

And during the lifetime of my son James and while either or all my daughters Martha Sarah & Anne remain single it is my Will and desire that they the or they have and interest in the aforementioned tract of land and dwelling house the same as in the lifetime of their father, so, so, that they have no power of disposing of it but may have it for a home provided it be their choice.

And I do hereby appoint my wife Mary Executor of my son Patrick Executor of this my last Will and Testament.

and Testaments by me made to wit

lives in good warm clothing victuals and drinks sufficient to support
them decently, and if either John or Annanah Stewart should fail
or neglect to take care of said children then they or either of
have it in their power to detain so much of the benefits of
said plantation as will be sufficient to support them in decency.
And to my son David Beale and my daughter Mary Beale I do
make bequeath to each of them a Case worth three pounds.
I will and bequeath to my daughter Jane Beale twenty pounds
to be paid in hand & called by the executor out of my personal estate
