In Gods great Name Amen I David Robinson of Washing-
ton County and state of Virginia in my sound mind and memory
but calling to mind the mortality of my body and that it is
appointed for all men once to die do make this my last will
and testament. And first of all I recommend my soul to
God who gave it and my body to the dust to be buried in a
decent manner according to the orders of my executor and as to
the worldly estate which with it hath pleased God to bless
me I do dispose of it in the following manner and first
I do allow and pay that all my lawful and just
debts be paid. I leave to my son John all that forty
dollars which he stands indebted to me which I paid
to Mr Samuel Doak on his account. I leave to my son
John one pocket bible, I leave to my two sons
Samuel and David two hundred acres of land which I
purchased from James Sagert in Logan County in Ken-
tucky State and out of the remainder of my estate I intend
to be bought one hundred Acres of land in the same neigh-
borhood where the before mentioned land lies and equal

231 in value to one hundred acres of the same which I leave to my son Alexander M^cHenry Robinson I leave to each and every one of my three daughters to wit Annabell and Sarah and Susannah after they shall arrive to the age of eighteen years, each of them one horse and saddle a piece and a bible a piece, the value of the horses and saddles and bibles I leave to the discretion of my executrix I leave my beloved wife Isabella all the remainder of my estate not before mentioned to be used by her kept or sold at her pleasure during her natural life time and after her decease to be equally divided amongst all my sons and daughters whose names are above written my son John excepted, and I do appoint my beloved wife Isabella to be the sole executrix of this my last will and testament, and I do hereby disavow and make void all my former wills and testament and do appoint and establish this to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand and eight hundred ---

At a Court held for Washington county the 18th day of March 1862 This last Will and Testament of David Robinson dec^d was exhibited into court and proved by the oaths of John Robinson and Alexander Robinson the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. At a Court held for Washington County the 16th day of September 1864 In the Matter of John Robinson the executor named in the last will and Testament of David Robinson dec^d and 1864

society entered into and acknowledges a bond in the sum
