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Articles of agreement Made and entered into 20th of Nov^r 1799 between Elizabeth Johnson widow, - Joel Hubbell, Samuel Douglas, Snelling Johnson Nancy Johnson Magaret Johnson Heirs of Curtice Johnson Dec^d all of Washington County and State of Virginia is as followeth to wit first the said Elizabeth Johnson widow of s^r Curtice Johnson do relinquish all her dower or part of the estate of the s^r Curtice Johnson and does give and bequeath it to be equally divided unto the heirs above

mentioned by name for and in consideration of a good and reasonable main tainance during the time of her life; from the heirs afore said 2^d. The above mentioned heirs each of them either for them selves or their guardians for these do interchangeably bind themselves to each other and to her their mother that they will punctually & faithfully comply and fulfill the agreement herein inserted - viz That each one is to be at equal charges at the supporting & maintaining the s^r Elizabeth Johnson with a comfortable main tainance during her life time, it is also further agreed to that Joel Hubbell is to take her to live with him and is to have the service of a certain Negro woman just withal to wait on her which service is to be considered a full satisfaction for the maintaining of her, providing the s^d negro should and continue to be capable of doing service - sufficient for his trouble and expences also if it should be that the s^d negro should die, or be unable to clear the charges of her

mistake it is agreed on that each of the above named heirs is to pay their proportionable part to settle the debt according to the judgment of men to the true performance of which we have hereunto set our hands and subscribed our names
