In the Name of God Amen I Francis Beale of
Washington County & Commonwealth of Virginia being at present of
sound mind and memory and considering that its appointed for all
men once to die but not knowing the certainty of the time
thereof do hereby make this my last Will and Testament that
is to say First and principally I recommend my soul to God
who gave it and my body to the earth there to be decently
buried. I Give and bequeath to my daughter Annanah
Stewart and John Stewart her husband the plantation now
now live on with all the farming Utensils & house such as
plows hoes &c. Also my Negro man named Jack.
Last is to say on this Condition that they or either of them or keep
my daughter Jack Beale and son Thomas Beale receiving their
lives in good warm clothing victuals and drinks sufficient to support
them decently, and if either John or Annanah Stewart should fail
or neglect to take care of said children then they or either of
have it in their power to detain so much of the benefits of
said plantation as will be sufficient to support them in decency.
And to my son David Beale and my daughter Mary Beale I Give
and bequeath to each of them a Cow worth three pounds.
I will and bequeath to my daughter Jane Beale twenty pounds
to be paid in hand & called by the executor out of my personal estate

And to my daughter Margaret Bradford Swill and bequeath my
 found to be paid in horses or cattle by the Executors out
 of my personal estate.

And the remainder of my personal Estate if any I leave
 to John and Coranna Stuart and I do hereby appoint my
 friends Matthew Ryburn and James Kincaid Executors of this
 my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all Wills by me
 before made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed
 and affixed my seal this ~~seventeenth~~ day of
 September 1799.

 the benefit of all my grain that may be in my possession
 at my decease as well to that is growing as what is sowed
 together with my flock of hogs one pair and some two pair
 of Geese until my youngest child shall attain to the age of
