In the Name of God Amen I Francis Cart of Washington county Virginia being at present though weak of body yet of perfect mind and memory and called to mind the uncertainty of this life and that it is appointed for all men once to die and after death to come to judgment do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in the manner following, first and principally I recommend my soul to almighty God who gave it and my body the last rest from whence it was taken to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my executors or executors and as for such things as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give and bequeath as follows Inprimis I will that all my just debts and funeral charges be fully paid and satisfied. Then I give and bequeath to my wife Catharine six thirds of all and every of my goods and chattels and all my wearing apparel after my aforesaid debts are paid to her only as person. Then I give and bequeath to my two daughters Mary and Elizabeth five shillings each one year after my decease. Then I give and bequeath all and every of the remainder of my goods and chattels to John Casper of said county whom I do also make executor and appoint my sole executor to this my last Will and Testament revoking and making void all former Wills and Testaments heretofore by me made ratifying this and this only my

my last will and Testament as witness my hand and seal this 2^d day of March 1794.

of my body and that it is appointed unto all men once to die do
make this as followeth my last will and testament viz.
I do cheerfully resign my soul to god who gave it and my body to the
dust to be decently interred by my executors. I do give and bequeath to
my beloved wife Anna Buchanan one third part of all my personal
property consisting of horses, cattle, sheep, hogs household furniture
and implements of husbandry and one Negro Woman, with the pro-
ceeds of her widowhood. I do likewise give and bequeath to my son
David Buchanan one hundred and eight acres of Land to be taken of the
East side of my Plantation with any improvements sold to Samuel
Buchanan and one in perpetuity. I do likewise give and bequeath to my son John Buchanan and
Joseph Buchanan my plantation at my wife's death or marriage
unless she require it to be sold, then my executors to sell it and
divide the price equally between my sons John and Joseph reserving
my wife's third part to her own use also one tenth more than
part sold to my son John Buchanan. The remaining two
parts of my ^{personal property} to be equally divided between my three daughters
Margaret Buchanan, Eliza Buchanan and Hannah Buchanan.

of any contract which I have made to be disposed of by my
