

In the Name of God Amens I Francis Kincaid
 being weak and sickly of body, the infirm mind and memory do make me publish
 this my last Will & Testament in manner following vizt. I command my soul to
 God and my body to the dust to be after death there buried in a Christian like
 manner at the discretion of my executors - my worthy Estate I will & bequeath as
 follows, I leave and bequeath to my well beloved wife Elizabeth Kincaid all my
 meable property and one third of my plantation and my dwelling houses during
 her natural life - I leave and bequeath to my son James Kincaid five
 pounds - I leave and bequeath to my son Andrew Kincaid five pounds -
 I leave and bequeath to my daughter Mary Smith fifty pounds - I leave and
 bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Costopold fifty pounds - I leave and
 bequeath to my Grand daughter Betty Scott Thirty pounds I will and bequeath
 to my son George Kincaid all the plantation in which he now dwells, his
 paying to Eliz. Smith & Elizabeth Costopold the above bequests to them
 named within the time hereafter specified - I will and bequeath to
 my son Matthew Kincaid all the plantation on which he now dwells his paying
 to James Kincaid Andrew Kincaid and Francis Kincaid and Betty
 Scott the sum by me above bequeathed and forty pounds to be equally divided
 between James and Francis Kincaid also all my Debts and funeral
 charges - I will and desire that the above bequests by me bequeathed be paid
 as I have directed, within the term of five years after my decease -
 And I hereby appoint James Kincaid and John Stewart Executors of
 this my last will & Testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made
 In witness whereof I have written this day of
 March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety five.

 the presence of the Testator.
