 be my true and lawful attorney for me and in my name and said to
 demand sue for recover and receive a certain negro woman slave by
 the name of Easter with all her increase the s^d Easter was by
 Nathaniel Dickerson sold to his son Charles Dickerson with a
 proviso that if the s^d Charles Dickerson should die without
 heir that the Estate given him by the said Nathaniel Dickerson
 should return to his surviving brothers and sisters, as will more
 records appear by giving and granting unto my s^d attorney by these
 presents my full and whole power strength and authority in and
 about the premises to have use and take all lawful ways and
 means in my name for the recovery of the said Easter and her
 increase and upon the receipt of the said Easter or any of her
 increase to give lawful and sufficient discharge which shall by
 virtue hereof be firm and effectual and in my name to do
 execute and perform as fully largely and amply to all intents
 and purposes as I myself might or could do if I was personally
 present in the due pursuit of the said Easter and her increase
 or as if the matter required more special authority than is
 herein given never to revoke but ratifying holding for firm and
 effectual all and whatsoever my said attorney shall lawfully do
 in pursuit of the said request by virtue whereof in witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this sixth day
 of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred and ninety nine and 28th of American Independence
 Signed sealed and delivered the Griffey Dickerson

W. 94 poles to two small white oaks and hickory
S. 42 W 36 poles to two W. oaks, S. 32 E. 134
poles to a large W. oak N. 63. E. 60 p. to a W.
oak N. 20 W. 58 p. to a W. oak N. 27 E. 35 poles
to the beginning. Now if the above bound Samuel
Evans do make a lawful and sufficient title to
the above describes land at or upon the fifteenth
day of October 1787 to the said James Dickenson
his heirs or assigns without paid or further delay
then this obligation ~~to~~ be void otherwise to remain
in full force and virtue in Law

enson have this day sold Robert Dukes twenty
acres of Land be the same more or less which being
the tract of Land that old Griffith Dickenson
now lives on lying in Washington County
about a mile from the town of Abingdon
and adjoining the lands of Christopher Glickin
Jacob Hagie and James Campbell for which
we have executed a bond bearing date the 27th
day of July 1799 for a title for the same
provided if we cant obtain a title from Samuel
Evans for² tract of land as mentioned above there
were to reimburse whatever money the said Dukes
paid in consideration of the said land Witness
