In the name of God Amen I Henry Arm-
strong of the county of Washington in the State of
Virginia being weak in body but of perfect mind
and memory, knowing the uncertainty of life,
do make establish and declare this as my
last Will & Testament in manner and form
following to wit. I order all my just debts
to be paid, if there shall hereafter appear
to be any. I do give devise and bequeath
unto my brother George Armstrong son of

John Armstrong of Kilbuck in the county of Annapolis
in District if he is living, all the right which I have
acquired to one moiety of a certain tract or parcel of
Land containing about fifty acres in Kilbuck in the
said county of Annapolis by virtue of my father John
Armstrongs Last Will and Testament, with all and
singular the appurtenances thereto belonging to
him and his heirs forever. But if he is dead
then it is to descend to his son George Armstrong
with all its appurtenances to him and his
heirs forever. And if he is dead, I do then
Will and bequeath the aforesaid Land with
all its appurtenances unto my brother John
Armstrong who resides in Kingston in Jamaica
son also of the aforesaid John Armstrong of Kil-
buck with all its appurtenances to him and
his heirs forever. I do also Will and bequeath all the
personal estate which descended to me by virtue of
my said father John Armstrongs Last Will and
Testament to my said brother George Armstrong if he
is living, but if he is dead, then it is to descend
to his son George Armstrong, and if he is dead,
I do then Will and bequeath the said personal
estate to my said brother John of Kingston
in Jamaica — I do also Will and bequeath
all my personal estate in the possession of
Crutcher & Jackson & Co in Philadelphia
State of Pennsylvania, and all the personal
estate which I am possessed of in the county
of Washington in Virginia or elsewhere to my
said brother George Armstrong if living, but
if dead to his son George Armstrong, and
if he is dead, it is then to descend to my
brother John Armstrong of Jamaica. I do
also Will and bequeath all Bonds Notes

amounts which I have against any person to my brother George if living, if dead to his son George but if he is dead then to my brother John, and I do Will in the same manner all money which I have on hand. I do order that my executors hereafter named do make sale of all my personal estate which may come into their possession and may use the money arising therefrom as before received. I do hereby nominate and appoint John Campbell, Jace of the County of Washington and his son David Campbell executors of this my last Will & Testament hereby revoking all other Wills & Testaments by me made, declaring this to be my last Will & Testament.

In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal this 25th day of August one thousand seven hundred and ninety eight signed sealed and acknowledged in the presence of us who at his request & in his presence signed our names as witnesses.
