die do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament

that is to say principally and first of all I give and
recommend my soul into the hand of Almighty God
that gave it and My body I recommend to the earth
to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion
of my exors nothing doubting but at the general
resurrection I shall receive the same again by the
mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate
wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this
life I give devise and dispose of the same in the
following manner and form.

First I give and bequeath to Susanna my dearly
beloved wife all my moveable estate likewise my
Land I leave to raise my children on till the youngest
comes to be of age then to be sold & equally divided
amongst my children. Also I leave my wife Susanna
whome I likewise constitute make and ordain the
sole executrix of this my Last Will and Testament
all and singular my Lands messuages and tenements
by her self to be possessed and enjoyed and I do hereby
utterly disallow revoke and annul all and every other
former Testaments Wills Legacies bequests & assignments
by me in any way before named written and bequeathed
ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my
Last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty
second day of august in the year of our Lord one
thousand seven hundred and ninety two.
