2nd After the payment of my debts and funeral expences I Give to wife Dolly Shell all that tract of Land on which I now live for & during the term of her natural life and after her decease I Give the same to My two sons Lewis & Henry to be equally divided between them and to be enjoyed by them forever & likewise I Give to my wife Dolly her Bed and furniture a cabinet & furniture also one Cow.

3rd I Give to my son Lewis the Negro girl named Esther.

4th I Give to my Daughter Elizabeth one hundred Dollars in Cash also two feather Beds & furniture & one Bureau.

5th I Give to my Daughter Susana one hundred Dollars in Cash also two Feather Beds & furniture & one Bureau.

6th I Give to my Daughter Katy one hundred Dollars in Cash also two Feather Beds & furniture & one Bureau.

7th I Give to my Daughter Margaret a horse to be valued at fifty Dollars.

8th I Give to my Daughter Polly five shillings Sterling

9th All the Rest of my estate both Real & personal of what nature or kind soever it may be I Desire it may be equally Divided between my two sons Lewis & Henry which I Give to them their heirs & assigns forever.

And Lastly I Do hereby constitute and appoint my friends Dolly Shell Lewis Shell & Philip Catron Executors of this my last Will & Testament hereby revoking all other or former wills or Testaments by me heretofore made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 4th day of Feb^y 1811.
