as may be after my decease And all my estate both  
real and personal then remaining I give and  
bequeath unto my dear wife Christiana during her  
natural life to be applied and disposed of as she  
may think proper, and after her decease I give  
and bequeath unto my daughter Hannah wife of  
John Hambleton living in Kentucky the sum of  
one Spanish milled dollar to be paid to her out of  
my estate in full for her share of my said estate  
I also give and bequeath unto my son George  
Stylo the sum of one Spanish milled dollar to be  
paid to him out my estate the same to be in full  
for his share And all the residue and remaining  
part of my estate Real and personal to the sum of  
what kind or nature soever I give and bequeath  
to be equally divided between all the remaining  
part of my Children and Grand Children not yet  
before named vizt to each of my sons Henry, Jacob,  
Abraham, and Isaac one equal share & to George  
Shankle and Elizabeth Shankle heirs of my daughter  
Christian Shankle deceased Jointly one equal  
share and to the lawful heirs of my daughter  
Catherine Mills one equal share of my real and  
personal estate aforesaid And lastly I constitute  
and appoint my beloved wife Christiana sole  
Executive of this my last Will and Testament  
humbly reciting and making void all former Wills

I KNOW all men by these presents that I Plan Ward of the County of Washington for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to me in hand paid before the sealing and delivery of these presents have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto George Shelly of Washington County all and singular the goods and chattels herein after mentioned to wit two Cows and Calfs one feather bed and one Chaff, and furniture, two Boxes and Gars, fourteen head of hogs, one Steer five hundred feet of plank, one Walnut Table, one pair of racing bars Box, 9 blankets four Coored, six plates plates four pails and two Pots - Also one iron pot, kettle and Skillet and one hundred weight of flax and twelve pounds of Cotton To have and to hold all and singular the said goods and chattels to him the said George Shelly and to his heirs and assigns and to his and their own proper use bought and behof forever as his and their own proper goods and chattels And I the said Plan Ward for myself my heirs Executors and Administrators do covenant with the said George Shelly and his execs and admrs that I the said Plan at the sealing and delivery of these presents have full power to grant and sell the said goods and chattels hereby granted, and that the said George Shelly his execs &c at all times hereafter have full power and authority properly to enjoy the said goods
