This Indenture made the Seventeenth day of August One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty four Between Mary Vincy of Washington County of the one part and Adam Hops of the same place of the other part Witnesseth that the Said Mary Vincy with freely Voluntarily put her Daughter Sarah aged two Years the 22nd of November last past Apprentice to the Said Adam Hops to serve him and his Assigns untill she shall come to the full age of Eighteen Years, during all which Time the Said Apprentice Her said Master faithfully shall serve according to her power Wit and Cholly — In Consideration whereof the said Adam Hops is hereby Obligated to find and provide sufficient Meat Drink Washing and Lodging and Apparel fitting for an Apprentice during the above Term, as also to Teach or Cause to be Taught and instructed to Read the Holy Scriptures. — And at the Expiration of the above Term to allow unto the Said Apprentice such freedom dues as is allowed to Servants imported into this Country Without Wages In Witness whereof the Parties to these Presents have hereunto interchangeably set their hands and seals the 22nd day of August first above Written

This Indenture Witnesseth that Stephen Hogg is put by order of the Court of Washington County an Apprentice to David Gutgood to learn the art and Mystery of the Taylor Trade, and with him after the Manner of an Apprentice to serve from the day of the date hereof until he is the age of twenty one years, during which time, the said Apprentice his master faithfully shall, his secrets keep, and all his Lawful commands every where gladly obey, he shall do no damage to his master nor see it done by others without letting or giving Notice thereof to his said master he shall not waste his said masters goods nor lend them unlawfully to others, he shall not commit fornication nor contract matrimony during the said time, he shall not play at cards, dice, or any other unlawful whereby his said master may be Damaged with his own goods or others, he shall not absent ^{himself} day or night from his said masters service unlawfully nor haunt taverns or play houses but in all things behave as a faithful Apprentice ought to do. — And the said master shall procure and provide for him sufficient meat, drink apparel lodging and washing, all other necessaries during the said time and shall give him such schooling as the law allows ^{the Taylor boy} and shall learn him the art and mystery of Trade, and him such freedom dues as the law allows and for the true performance of all and every of the said covenant and agreement either of the said parties bind themselves to the other jointly by these presents.

This Indenture witnesseth that Symath Hogg is put by Order of the Court of Washington County an Apprentice to John Bradley son until she arrives at the age of Eighteen Years and with him after the Manner of an apprentice to serve from the day of the date hereof and during which time the said Apprentice her Master faithfully shall serve his secrets keep and all his Lawfull Commands Every where Gladly Obeyshe shall do no damage to her said Master nor set it done by Others without Letting or giving notice thereof to her said Master she shall not with her said Master goods nor ~~as~~ them unlawfully to Others she shall not Commit fornication nor Contract Matrimony During the said Time she shall not Absent herself any way from her said Master ^{Service} ~~unlawfully~~ but in all things behave as a faithful Apprentice Ought to do and the said Master shall provide and procure for her sufficient Meat drink apparel Laying and Washing and all other Necessaries during the said time and shall give her such schooling as the Law allows or pay for in such cases and shall pay her such freedom dues as the Law allows and for the True Performance of all and every of the said Covenant and Agreement either of the said parties bind them selves to the other jointly by these presents In witness whereof we have interchangeably set our Hands and Seals this Tenth day of December in the Year of our Lord One thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty five

Know all men by these presents that I Andrew Calvill of the County of Washington in the State of Virginia have bargained and sold unto Robert Montgomery of the said County a part of the tract of land I now live on for the sum and consideration of one hundred pounds to me in hand paid the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge the Division line to begin at or near a spring on the bank where the said Calvill lives and James Cyfers and running to a corner tree of said land upon the top of the ridge above the Meeting house spring I then Andrew Calvill for myself my heirs Executors and Administrators do covenant and agree with the said Robert Montgomery his heirs or assigns to make a lawful and sufficient Title in fee simple for all that part of the tract of Land that lies North of the Division line before mentioned being the land that Archelaus Brumby now lives on which Title is to be Executed and made on or before the fifteenth day of October 1785. In witness whereof I have herunto set my hand and Seal this sixth day of October 1784.
