 cattle Sheep and hogs, also the use of my Negroes Daniel
 a fellow and Hannah a Wench, also Sarah & Lotty.

2 I give & bequeath unto my Grand daughter Jean Irvine one
 hundred dollars to be made out of my estate when ever she shall
 come of age or marry to her and her heirs forever.

3 I give and bequeath unto my Grand son George Campbell
 son of James Campbell my negro fellow Daniel after his
 Grand mothers decease, also a bay mare now in my possession
 to him and to his heirs forever.

4 I give and bequeath unto my Grand son Jacob Campbell
 son of James Campbell my negro wench Hannah with all
 her furniture, at the decease of his Grand mother, to
 him and his heirs forever.

5 I give and bequeath unto my Grand son James Campbell
 son of James Campbell my negro girl Sarah after the decease
 of his Grand mother also my bay mare and Colt to him and
 his heirs forever.

6 I give unto my my Grand son Robert Campbell son of
 James Campbell my negro girl Lotty after the decease of his
 mother to him and his heirs forever.

7 I give and bequeath unto my Grand daughter Jean Canary one
 cow to her and her heirs forever.

8 I give and bequeath unto my son in Law James Campbell
 my Gray mare to him and his heirs forever.

9 I give unto my son in Law John Canary one dollar to
 him and his heirs forever.

10 I give and bequeath unto my son in Law John Irvine
 one dollar to him and his heirs forever.

Specially I do hereby nominate and appoint my son in Law
 James Campbell John Keys & James Keys my whole and
 sole executors to this my Last Will and Testament. In
 Witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and seal this 28th
 day of December one thousand seven hundred and ninety four.
