Memory thanks be given to god Calling to mind the mortality of my Body &
Knowing that it is appointed for all ^{men} once to die do make & order this my last
Will and Testament. That is to say principally & first of all I give and
Recommend my Soul into the hand of almighty god that gave it & my Body
I Recommend to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian Burial at the
Discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of god & as touching of such
Worldly Estate which with it has pleased god to place in this life I
have given and dispose of the same in the following manner & form
First I give & bequath to Judith my dearest and beloved Wife the fifth
part of my Estate Except the gun together with all my household goods
And furniture I also leave the whole of this my Estate in the hands & under
the Direction of Judith my wife to Raise the Children upon & give such
Education as may be convenient & as the Come of age to be divided & Receive
there legacies I also give to my well beloved Sons Patrick & John the Parcel or tract
of Land I now possess Lying in the glades hallow to be Equally divided between them
When the Patrick Comes of age I also gave & bequath to Jeremiah Picket my wife
The Rifle gun I now possess to receive when he comes of age
I also Leave Judith my wife my Sole Executrix of this my last
Will and Testament all & Singular my Lands & messuages & tenements
by her freely to be Possessed & Enjoyed till Patrick & John Comes of age
& I hereby utterly disallow Revoke & Disannull all & Every other
Former testaments Wills Legacies bequests & Executors by me in any wise
before named Willed & bequathed Rectifying and Confirming this and no
other to be my last will & Testament I witness whereof I have
Hereunto set my hand and Seal this Ninth Day of August in the year
of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred & Seventy nine 1779
