 of Judgment and memory, calling to mind the mortality of this body
 and that it is appointed for all men once to die do recommend
 my soul to God who gave it & my body to be buried in a
 decent Christian manner at the direction of my Executors, and
 as for what worldly estates of goods & chattels it has pleased
 God to bless me with in this life I order leave and
 bequeath in the following manner viz first I leave and
 bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret all the movables
 I am possessed of at this time to use and dispose of as
 she thinks proper, and the negro woman Sella during
 her life and after her decease to be given to my daughter
 Peggy to her & her heirs. I order and leave the Land
 to be divided in the following manner viz to John
 William two hundred and fifty acres and to son James
 two hundred acres, to be divided as they think proper and
 to my son Alexander forty acres amongst his Own Land
 and I do hereby revoke and annul all other wills and
 Testaments and do confirm this to be my Last will and
 Testament, and do appoint my beloved wife Margaret and
 son Alexander ~~Executors~~ to execute this my Last will and
 Testament, in Witness whereof I do here by set my hand
 and Seal this seventh day of November one thousand
 seven hundred and ninety nine 1799.

At a court held for Washington county the 17th day of December 1799
 the Last will and Testament of James Doran, dec^d was presented
 in court by the oath of Adam Hope John McCauley & David
 Lowrey the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And
 in the motion of Alexander Doran one of the executors
 therein named who took the oath prescribed by Law, and
 together with David Lowrey his security entered into and
 acknowledged their bond in the sum of two thousand dollars
 conditioned as the Law directs. A Certificate is therefore
 granted him for the probat of the said Will in due form.
