My desire is that she apply to Alexander Hamilton for them, and that she discharge for me to them for their trouble with me while sick on their hands the sum of twelve shillings for their trouble, and my earnest desire is that you whom I intrust with my Children and Estate may justly discharge your Duty in seeking my Children as long as my Affairs with absolute of my Attempts you possibly can collect with support, And I do hereby empower and intreat my Wife to let them I do frankly and freely forgive for all and every of her former Transgressions against me, with the charge of my Affairs and with the care and charge of my Children and do charge her from this that she occasionally dispose of my Estate according to this my last Will & Testament given under my hand and sealed with my seal this eighth Day of October in the Year of our Lord Christ One thousand seven hundred and seventy six.
