buried after my decease in a decent Christian manner at
the discretion of my Executors. And for what worldly estate
goods & chattels It has pleased God to bless me with in
this life I do order allow & bequeath them in the following
manner viz. first I order & allow all my just debts to be
paid

I leave and bequeath to my beloved Wife Margaret full &
free use & possession of the Plantation on which I now live
with all its appurtenances, all the farming utensils, Waggons
and every thing within the house & belonging thereto, except
such goods as will be hereafter disposed of all the slaves with
their increase except Jack ^{five} ~~four~~ horse creatures namely Bon
& Snip with their spring colts & Jim all the sheep, all the hogs
& all the cattle except five head of the third rate, & others
that will be hereafter disposed of the above mentioned pro-
perty with the increase of the fore mentioned sheep, hogs &
cattle. all for the term of five years for her use for the
purpose of raising and schooling the children. I further
leave & bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret the house
over
