And as touching such worldly Estate whereunto it has pleased the Almighty to bless me in this life, I give, devise and bequeath of the same in the following manner, I first I give and bequeath to Anna my dearly beloved Wife all my Estate during her life term of years made of the same to my Children. Also I constitute make and ordain my well beloved Wife the whole and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament, all and singular Meesages and tenements, by her self to be possessed and enjoyed. And I do utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former Testaments, bequests and bequests by in any wise before named, willed and bequeathed, ratified & confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this eighth day of June in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and eighty three.
