And on the Motion of Andrew McMillan one of the executors therein named who took the oath of an executor prescribed by Law & entered into & acknowledged his bond with John Henderson, John Chatters, John Davis, John Teater, John Fleenor Abam Nortonstone & John Gray, his securities in the sum of five thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs - A Certificate is therefore granted him for the probat of the said Will & Codicil in due form.
