Know all men by these presents that I John Balfour of Washington County and State of Virginia for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars to me in hand paid Do bargain and sell unto Alexander Hamilton one negro man slave named Isaac and do for myself my heirs &c forever warrant and defend the said slave to the said Hamilton against the claims of all persons whomsoever Witness my hand and seal this 1st day of July 1806 John Balfour

I do hereby assign and transfer the within Bill of Sale to Frederick Hamilton for value received, without being in any manner liable to the said Frederick Hamilton for damages should the title to the said slave fail or be adjudged defective. Witness my hand and seal this 21st day of November 1807
