play at Cards, Dice or any unlawful game, whereby his said Master may be damaged with ^{him} ~~himself~~
or the goods of others. He shall not absent himself from his said Masters service Day or night unlaw-
fully nor commit any other filigious or Tascars but in all things shall behave himself as a
faithful Apprentice ought to do. And the said Master shall protect and provide for the said
Apprentice sufficient Meat Drink Apparel Washing and Lodging and all other things necessary
during the said Term, and shall give him such Schooling as the law allows Craftsmen in such Cases
and pay him such Freedom dues as the law allows. And for the due performance of all every the
foregoing the said Master and Apprentice have hereunto set their Hands & Seals the 17th Day
of August in the fourth Year of the Commonwealth of the Year of our Lord 1779

This Indenture

made with the consent and approbation of the Court of
Washington County the sixteenth Day of November, In the Year of our Lord One thousand
seven hundred and eighty four Between John Campbell of the One part, and Thomas
Edmondson of the other part Witnesseth that the said John Campbell & the said Thomas
Edmondson both put a boy named John behind aged ten Years in April last past
Apprentice to the said Thomas Edmondson to serve him and his Assigns from the Day of the
last hereof until he shall arrive to the full Age of twenty one Years, all which Time the said
Apprentice his said Master faithfully shall serve according to his power wit and ability.
And the said Thomas Edmondson for himself his Assigns and Assigns doth hereby covenant
with the said John Campbell that he the said Thomas Edmondson during the above Term shall
teach or cause to be taught the said Apprentice the Art and Mystery of a Weaver & will provide
and allow the said Apprentice sufficient Meat Drink Apparel Washing & Lodging, and all
other necessaries fitting such an Apprentice according to the Laws and Customs of this Common-
wealth, and also shall teach or cause to be taught and instructed the said Apprentice to read
write and cipher as the Law requires in such Cases. In Witness whereof the parties aforesaid
