In the Name of God Amen
 I John Carmack of the County of Washington in the State of Virginia being of sound and disposing mind and memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of life do make this my last Will & Testament in manner and form as followeth and first of all I will and direct that all my Just debts be paid out of my moveable Estate and then my wife is to have the Benefits of my plantation, House & furnitures during her natural life and then it is to be divided between my son William and my Grand^{son} James son to my daughter Nelly which I raised and lived with me from a child that is to say one hundred acres to James to be taken of the upper end of the land and to run a straight line across and all the remainder after my wifes decease I give and bequeath to my son William and his heirs forever and all my moveables after my wifes decease I give and bequeath to my sons John and William and to my daughters Sally Gray and Sally Warfield to be equally divided among them. I also Give and bequeath to my Wife the use and labour of my negro fellow Will during her life and at her decease I give and bequeath the said negro Will to my son William and his heirs forever and that these devises may be properly understood my wife is to have the whole during her life, and then it is to be divided as above expressed, and I do appoint my two sons John Carmack and

William Carmack Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made, declaring this to be my only last Will and Testament. - Given under my hand and seal this 27th day of August 1810

The last Will & Testament of John Carmack dec^d. was exhibited into Court proven by the oath of John Campbell & Arthur Campbell two of the subscribing witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of John Carmack & William Carmack the executors therein named who took the oath of an executor prescribed by Law & entered into and acknowledged their bonds with Hugh McChesney & Andrew Willoughby securities in the sum of Three thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs. - A certificate is therefore granted them for the probate of the said Will in due form.
