of ^{body} ~~head~~ but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be to God for
the same, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testa-
ment in manner and form following - I give and bequeath to my son James Crabtree one dollar and no
more - Item I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Crabtree
one dollar and no more - Item I give and bequeath to my
daughter Hannah Fields one dollar and no more - Item I
give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Crabtree one
dollar and no more - Item I give and bequeath to my
son Samuel Crabtree one dollar and no more - Item I
give and bequeath to my son Richard Crabtree one dollar
and no more - Item I give and bequeath to my son
Jesse Crabtree one dollar and no more - Item I give and
bequeath to my son Simeon Crabtree one dollar and no
more - Item I give and bequeath to my son William
Crabtree one dollar and no more - Item I give and bequeath
to my wife Semina Crabtree the balance of my estate both
real and personal during her natural life or widowhood,
for the support of herself and children; which are at present
living with her and after the death or marriage of my
wife Semina Crabtree my Will is that all my estate
which I have bequeathed to her both real and personal be
sold at public sale on one twelve months credit and the
money arising from the sale to be divided amongst my
children hereafter named as follows to wit, To my son
John Crabtree one fifth part, to Moses Crabtree one tenth
part, to Rhoda Crabtree one tenth part, to Chloe Crabtree
one tenth part, to Abram Crabtree one tenth part to
Mary Crabtree junior one tenth part, to Sarah Crabtree
one tenth part, to Isaac Crabtree one tenth part, and
to Jacob Crabtree one tenth part, and if any of my
nine children last named should die without heirs
of their body, or before they arrive to the age of being
one if a male, or eighteen if a female my will is
that their part of my estate shall fall to the rest
of the last mentioned nine children to be equally
divided amongst them. Lastly I nominate and appoint
my wife Semina Crabtree and my son Jesse Crabtree
executors and administrators of this my last Will & Testament
lawfully revoking all former Will or Wills by me made

314. acknowledging this only to be my last Will and Testament
as Witness my hand and seal this twenty fifth day of
January one thousand eight hundred and two.

At a Court held for Washington County the 18th day of January
1809 The last Will and Testament of John Crabbie deceased
was produced in Court and proven by the oaths of William
Boston and Abraham Crabbie the subscribing witnesses.
The will was then read and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of
Jemima Crabbie and Phebe Crabbie the Executrix and
Executor therein named who took the oath prescribed by
Law and together with William Boston and William
Crabbie their securities entered into and acknowledged
their bond in the sum of one thousand five hundred
dollars conditioned as the law directs. A subpoena is
therefore granted them for the probate of the said Will
in due form.

2^d With respect to such worldly goods as I may be
possessed of at my decease, I dispose of in the following
manner. that is to say (After all my just debts are paid)
I give and bequeath to the Trustees of the Fund for
the relief and support of the itinerant, superannuated
and worn out Ministers & preachers of the Methodist Episcopal
Church (in the United States of America) their wives
and children widows and orphans "the sum of sixty
six dollars and two thirds of a dollar to be paid
