I John Kendrick of Washington County & State of Virginia farmer very sick & weak of body but of perfect memory & Judgment thanks be to God Calling unto mind the ~~mortality~~ of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die I do make & ordain this my last Will & Testament that is to say principally & first of all I Give & Recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that Gave it and my Body I Recommend to the earth to be buried in Decent Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executors Nothing doubting but at the Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God & as touching such worldly estates which God has pleased to Bless me with in this life I Give & Dispose of the same in the following manner & form

First I Give & bequeath unto my Dearly beloved Wife Elizabeth the one third of all my inheritance after all my Just Debts is paid the Remainding to be equally Divided among my Children Namely Beginning at William then Mathey & one Now being in the Womb & if any of them dying in minority their share is to go to the succeeding heirs I appoint my Wife to be Executrix & William Summers & Richard Summers to be Executors whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 18th Day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & ten

This last Will & Testament of John Kendrick dec^d was exhibited in Court proved by the Oaths of James Folly & John Russell two of the subscribing witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded. Richard Summers one of the executors named in the said Will appeared in Court & referred the executorship. And on the motion of Elizabeth Kendrick the executrix and William Summers the other executor named in the said Will who took the oath prescribed by law & together with John Russell George Hickam William Smith, Thomas Kendrick James Head & Samuel Wilson their security entered into & acknowledged their bond in the sum of five thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs. A Certificate of the probat of the said Will is therefore granted the said Elizabeth Kendrick & William Summers in due form.

Know all men by these presents that I William Love of Washington County & State of Virginia for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars to me in hand paid by Robert Mitchell jr have bargained & sold to said Robert the following personal property to wit:

two feather beds & bedding, two Bed s, heads & Cords — four chairs
one table one Dozen Delft plates — one large pewter Dish —
one set Knives & forks — one cutting box — one plough two pair
Drawing chains — two pair hains — two horse Collars — two
mares — one Cow — one two year old heifer one yearling heifer
seven teen Hogs — one man saddle — one woman saddle two bridles
one ax — two weeding hoes one Wash tub one little spinning wheel
one Cotton Wheel — two Water pots one honey pot — one steel trap
one Dutch oven one pot a quantity of unboiled flax & geese &
turkeys & one Rifle which said property I hereby Warrant &
defend to the s^d Robert Mitchell jr from the claims of all
persons whomsoever. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this 17th day of October 1810

It is further agreed by and between the said parties that
when said Love shall well & truly pay to said Mitchell the sum
of eighteen dollars & shall give Robert Mitchell sen^r good

Saw direct. A Certificate is therefore granted him for the probat of the said Will in due form.
