Virginia, I John Snodgrass of Washington County and State of Virginia, being at present full in body yet of perfect mind and memory thanks be to Almighty God and calling to mind the uncertainty of this life and that it is appointed for all man once to die and after that to come to judgment Do make and order this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following

And first I recommend my soul to Almighty God my Creator who give st trusting that I shall receive full pardon and free remission of all my sins and obtain eternal life in and thro the precious Death and merits of Jesus Christ my blessed Saviour and her redeemer and my body to the earth from whence it was taken undoubtedly Believing that I shall receive the same again at the general Resurrection at the last day thro the mighty power of God whereby he is able to subdue all things unto himself and as for such worldly goods and Estate with which it hath pleased God to bless me with in life I leave and bequeath as followeth, Inprimis I will that all my just debts and funeral charges be fully paid and satisfied, Item I give and bequeath to my loving wife Mary Snodgrass for and during her natural life one third of my Estate and likewise my dwelling house that I now live in if she thinks proper to remain there and his third of the moveables to be at her own disposal And my will is that my three Daughters Elizabeth Elenis and Mary have there living on said land while the two single, and my will is that my son Matthew is to have his living of my two Sons Joseph and John which ever he chooses to live with And further my will is that Joseph and John as they enjoy the half of the land that each of them payes to my three Daughters Elizabeth Elenis and Mary to the sum of twenty pounds each twenty pounds in trust to be paid to Elenis ten pounds in trust to Elizabeth and ten pounds in trust to Mary And likewise my will is that my three Sons David and William and Joseph has each of them five Shillings and my son in law James Duffy five Shillings Likewise my will is that my son John at his Matheres decease to have the half of that tract of land and

plantation wheron we now live to be and remain dis from this time  
and forever I likewise give and bequeath to my said son John Snodgrap  
ymp two work horses and plow and gears and plantation utensils  
to work said land and all to be paied by men chosen for that  
purpose and and likewise the wagon is to remain on said place  
for the use thereof and when things are paied my will is  
that my three Daughters Elizabeth and Elizas and Mary -  
has each of them a childs part besides the forty pounds a =  
bove mentioned and likewise to have these living of said place  
with the live single as as above mentioned and my will is that if any  
one of the three dies then my will is that his part be divided  
between the other two; lastly I do hereby constitute ordain and ap-  
point James Duffy and William Snodgrap my son in law  
and son joint executors of this my last will and Testa-  
ment Revoking and making void all former and other -  
Testaments Legacies and executors rectifying and confirming thereby  
this only to my last Will and Testament. In witness-  
whereof I now hereunto set my hand and seal this eighth  
day of Jun in the year of our Lord one thousand seven  
hundred and ninety five.

At a court held for Washington County the 15<sup>th</sup> day of March 1795  
This last will and Testament of John Snodgrap aforesaid was en-
