In the Name of God. Amen the 25 Sept 1798

I John Walker of the County of Washington being Sick in Body but of good and sound Memory, Thanks to a Mighty God and baling to mind the uncertain Evils of This Transitory of Life and that Fleck must yeald to Death when it Shall Please God to Call, do make, Constitute ordain and Declair this my Last Will and Testament in Manner and Form following and in witness whereof I have signed all and Every Testament or Testaments Will or Wills Hereafter by me Made or Declared either by word or Writing; and this to be my Last Will and Testament and None other; and first being Sentent for my sins Last Most Humbly Desire Forgiveness for the same, I give and commit my soul unto almighty God my saviour and Redeemer in whom and by the Merits of Jesus Christ I Trust and Believe assuredly to be Saved & to have full Remission and forgiveness of all my sins and that my soul with my Body at a general Day of the Resurrection shall rise again with Joy and though the Merit of Christ Death have I See and Inherit the Kingdom of Heaven Prepared for his Elect and Chosen; and my Body to Buried in such a Place as will Please my Executors Hereafter Named, to appoint and Now for the Settling of my Temporal Estate and such goods and Chattels and Debts as it hath Pleas'd God far above may Deserts to bestow upon me; I Do order give, and Dispose the same in Manner and form following; That is to say, I Will that all those Debts & Dues as I own in Right & Conscience to any Manner of Person or Persons Whatsoever what be well and Truly Contracted and Paid or ordered to be Paid within Convenient time after My Decease by my Executors Hereafter Named. Item I give and Bequeath the Money that is in Patrick Coster hand that I have his Bonds and Account for to be Equally Divided amongst my Six Daughters and Grand Daughters An Well and order that all my Debts that is owing to me be Collected by my two sons Viz John and Samuel Walker and when Collected al my Creditors to be Paid and the Remainder to be Equally Divided betwixt my two sons Except that is Divided already and I do appoint my Two sons John and Samuel Walker My Executors This given under my hand and seal the Day and year above Written 1798 My Land to be Equally Divided betwixt my two Sons and one Bay mare I give to my Grand son William Walker
