In the Name of God Amen that I John Woods of Washing-
ton County & state of Virginia being weak in body but of a sound mind
and memory blessed be God for all his mercies and calling to mind the
mortality of my body and that it is appointed for all men once to die
I do recommend my soul to God who gave it and my body to be bur-
ied in a Christian way and manner at the discretion of my Executors
and as for what worldly goods as it has pleased to God to bless
me with at this time I do over and bequeath in the following manner
viz. I leave and bequeath to my beloved wife Lettice after my lawful
debts and funeral charges be paid one room House and the hearth
she lies on with its furniture likewise I leave and bequeath to my
daughter Elizabeth a bed and furniture and a pot of five gallons and
a saddle and her wheel I give and bequeath all the land that I pos-
sess my four youngest sons equally remaining the inheritance to

I have two youngest sons with whom my wife Letitia is to live and have a proper maintenance while she lives likewise I will and assign that all the rest of my movable estate be at my wife ordering to keep herself and younger sons and family together and schooling and raising them likewise I give and bequeath my large book of Prayers unto my son James and I do hereby make and disannul all former Wills and testaments and ratify and confirm this as my last Will and Testament as witness my hand and seal this 2nd day of November in the year of our Lord 1789.

Likewise I appoint George Dawson and my sons James and John Willson as Executors of this my last will Testament
