Evans of Washington County and State of Virginia for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred Dollars, It being for a Bond Given him the 8 day of October 1806 Due against the first day of March 1807 To David Martin Do Bargain and Sell and do live unto the said David Martin and his heirs forever, the following Property, To wit, One Waggon and four Oxen two head of horse beasts two mens Saddles and bridles, and one Womans Saddle, five head of hords, Cattle, and all our house hold & kitchen furniture such as beds and furniture Chests Stables pewter pots & bake ovens, It being our property and in our possession, at the time of executing this instrument and we the said John Young & Jere T. Evans for ourselves or selves our heirs &c. do covenant with the said David Martin this heirs that we for ourselves & our heirs will forever warrant and defend the said property above mentioned to the said David Martin & his heirs against the Claims of of all persons whomsoever, Further the said David Martin doth agree to let the sd. John Young & Jere T. Evans have the use of the above property till he calls for it, yet upon Condition never the less that if the said John Young & Jere T. Evans or their heirs &c. shall not and truly pay the said David Martin and his heirs &c. the sum of five Hundred Dollars then this bill of sale and every thing contained therein be void and of none effect otherwise to remain in full Virtue,

Ustick have bargained and sold, for and in consideration of the just sum of twenty pounds lawful money of Virginia to me in hand paid by the said William King & Co.
