

The Commonwealth of Virginia to the Sheriff of Washington County greeting. Whereas it appears that John Campbell hath there simple property in the lands in this County, on both sides of the north fork of Holston river nigh the broad ford, & desires to build a water grist mill on the said land, and to erect a dam across the said river for working the said mill. Therefor we command you to summon Venerable twelve fit persons, to meet upon the lands proposed for the abutment, on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of this month, which freeholders shall be charged by you impartially and to the best of their knowledge and judgment, to examine the lands above and below of the property of others, which may probably be overflowed, & say to what damage it will be of to the several proprietors, and whether the mansion house of any such proprietor, or the offices curtilage or gardens thereto immediately belonging, or orchards will be overflowed, to enquire whether in what degree fish of passage & ordinary navigation will be obstructed, whether by any, and by what means such obstruction may be prevented, and whether in their opinion the health of the neighbours will be endangered by the stagnation of the waters, which inquest so made & sealed by the said jurors, together with this writ, you shall return to our next Court to be holden for our said County of Washington Witness John Campbell Clerk of our said Court at the Courthouse this 24<sup>th</sup> day of August 1811, in the 36<sup>th</sup> year of our foundation

- 1<sup>st</sup> That no lands either above or below the said abutment the property of others except the said John Campbell will be overflowed by the erection of the said abutment.
- 2<sup>d</sup> That the mansion house office curtilage, gardens or orchards of no Person will be overflowed.

255 3 That the Passage of Fish will be obstructed but believed  
their number to be so small as not to admit of any public  
utility

4 We Concur the river at that place to be so small as to  
admit of Navigation whatever.

5 We believe the health of the Neighbours will not be endan-  
gered by the stagnation of the Waters. Given under our hands
