I John Greig of the county of Washington in the State of
Virginia being weak in body, but of sound mind and memory,
calling to mind the uncertainty of this life, do make this my
Last Will and Testament in the following manner and form,
And first of all I resign my soul into the hands of my
Almighty Creator and gracious Redeemer in full belief
and hope of a gracious acceptance through the mediation of
Jesus Christ my only Saviour, and my body to be buried
in a decent Christian manner at the discretion of my executors

hereafter named and as to such worldly goods as I have from
the Lord to bless me with, I dispose of in manner and form
following, I Will and ordain that the plantations that I now live
upon be divided into three equal Tracts according to quantity and
quality, the first that my son William lives on I give and
bequeath to him, the second live not to extend lower than
the lower end of the improvement he lives on, the part that
I live upon I give and bequeath to my son John, and the
other part which is the middle plantation to my son Thomas
and the several division live to be ready, Mr Robert
Breston, Joseph Gray and John Campbell, which I suppose
to lay off ^{the same Tracts} agreeable to this Will. I give and bequeath to
my beloved wife Jean all the profits that may arise from
my two lots in the Town of Abingdon, she to apply it to
the use of the family until my son Thomas is of age, and
afterwards the whole profits of the said lots to be paid
bequeath to my said wife Jean during her natural life
and after her decease I give and bequeath the said two
lots to my daughter Jean and her heirs forever. I give and
bequeath to my said wife Jean all my Stock of horses, cattle,
Sheep and hogs, all my plantation utensils my household
and kitchen furniture to be at her disposal, also all my
on bonds or book accounts except three bonds otherwise
appropriated, all lawfull debts to be paid out of my personal
estates. — And I do appoint my well beloved wife
Jean executrix and my trusty friends Robert Breston
and John McCombs counters of this my Last Will and
Testament hereby revoking all other Wills and Testaments
by me heretofore made declaring this only to be my Last
Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have
unto set my hand and seal this eighth day of January one
thousand seven hundred and ninety five.
