of October 1801.

This last Will and Testament of Isaac
Anderson deceased was exhibited into court and proved
by the oath of John Byars and Jacob Blesing
the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be
recorded; John Byars one of the executors named
in the said Will appeared in court and refused
to undertake the execution of the said Will. On
motion of Isaac Anderson the other executor named
in the said Will also took the oath of an
executor prescribed by Law and together with
Jacob Blesing his security entered into and
acknowledged a bond in the sum of three
thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs.

A Certificate for the probat of the said Will
is therefore granted to him in due form.

her decease the Negro Fellow Will I bequeath to
my Grandson Jonathen Whitley and Fanny to
be free & I further bequeath to my Grandson Jo-
nathen Whitley one negro Fellow named George
and a bond due from Joseph French to me. I
give and bequeath to my son in law John Mitchel
all the remainder of my moveable property one
small bay horse to be given to my Sonntaw James
Davis and also the Tracts of Land or plantation
whereon I now live I give to said John Mitchel
and his wife my daughter then natrall life and
at this death bequeath said Land to my Grand-
son Jonathen Mitchel I give and bequeath to my
belooved Grandson Jonathen Davis a tract of land
that belongs to me lying on the waters of Hol-
steins river and my Grandson Jonathen Mitchel
when he possesses the land where I now live he is
to pay to his Sister Lily Mitchel thirty pounds
sterling Cash or forty pounds in Trade I like-
wise constitute and confirm & make and ordain
as my executor Henry Plaxo John Mitchel
and James Davis of this my last Will and
Testament - and I do hereby utterly disallow
revoke and disannul all and every other for-
mer Testaments Wills legacies bequeaths and
Executors by me in any wise before mentioned
Willed or bequeathed Ratifying & confirming
