 & feeble but having my perfect understanding after my due reflection
 on the Goodness of God and the Blessings of His Providence, do hereby
 give and bequeath to my surviving wife, ^{Elizabeth} ~~Frederick~~ all my Estate, Goods and Land
 & my personal property with all the improvements and all my several Covenants
 for Life and to Joseph Sen. & my son Hugh each to receive five pounds
 after he is of age and having wife is dead then as followeth I give &
 bequeath to my son Joseph Sen. five pounds to my daughter Elizabeth ten
 pounds and to my son Anna five pounds and to my daughter Mary ten
 pounds this being my last will and Testament I make my son
 Joseph Sen. and Elizabeth my son Executors and what I have
 & remain to here be to the funeral costs and expences all paid for
 the Executors to divide the Remainder Equally between them
 This being my last will and Testament a Witness whereof
 I have hereunto subscribed my Name and Affixed my Seal
 this 22nd Day of April in the 24th Year of our Lord 1795

This Indenture made the Eighteenth day of August in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty three the fifth day of May last past is by Order of Court dated the Day of last past is put an apprentice to Frederick Freiley to serve him his Heirs and assigns until he shall arrive to the full age of twentyone years During all which time the said Apprentice his said master faithfully shall serve according to his power Skill and ability And the said Frederick Freiley is hereby obliged to find and provide for the said Apprentice sufficient Meat Drink Washing lodging and Apparel during the above Term And at the Expiration of the above Term to give or cause to be given unto the said Apprentice such freedom Quota as is Allowed to Servants imported into this Country without wages In Witness Whereof the Parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and Seals the Day and Year above Written
