precious Death and merits of Jesus Christ my blessed Saviour and Res-
deemer and my body to the earth from whence it was taken un-
doubtedly Believing that I shall receive the same againe at the
general Resurrection at the last day thro the mighty power
of God whereby he is able to subdue all things unto himself and as
for such worldly goods and Estate with which it hath pleased
God to bless me with in life I leave and bequeath as
followeth, Imprimis I will that all my just debts and
funeral charges be fully paid and satisfied, Item I give
and bequeath to my loving wife Mary Incegraph for and
during her Natural life one third of my Estate and likewise
my dwelling house that I now live in if she thinks
proper to remain there and her third of the moveables
to be at her own disposal And my will is that my three
Daughters Elisabeth Elenis and Mary have there living on
said land untill the live single, and my will is that
my son Matthew is to have his living of my two Sons
Joseph and John which ever he chuses to live with
And further my will is that Joseph and John as they en-
joy the hole of the land that each of them pay to
my three Daughters Elisabeth Elenis and Mary to the
sum of twenty pounds each twenty pounds in
treas to be paid to Elenis ten pounds in treas
to Elisabeth and ten pounds in treas to Mary
And likewise my will is that my three sons David and
William and Joseph has each of them five Shillings
and my son in Law James Buffy five Shillings like-
wise my will is that my son John at his Mothers
desire to have the hole of that tract of land and

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plantation whereon we now live to be and remain his from this time
and power I likewise give and bequeath to my said son John Snod-
grass two work horses and plow and gear and plantation suitable
to work said land and all to be pressed by men chosen for that
purpose and and likewise the waggon is to remain on read for
for the use thereof and when things are pressed my will is
that my three Daughters Elizabeth and Elener and Mary-
has each of them a child's part besides the forty pounds a-
bove mentioned and likewise to have these living of said place
with the live single as as above mentioned and my will is that if any
one of the three dies then my will is that his part be divided
between the other two; lastly I do hereby constitute ordain and ap-
point James Duffey and William Snodgrass my son in Law
and son joint executors of this my last Will and Testa-
ment Revoking and making void all former and other
Testaments Legacies an exetors rectifying and confirming therein
this only to my last Will and Testament. In witness
whereof I now hereunto set my hand and seal this eight
day of Jun in the year of our Lord one thousand seven
hundred and ninety five.
