

To all whom it may concern We Mary King, James King and William Trigg having for the reason hereafter mentioned come to a conclusion to dispense with the services of John Mitchell as manager at the Saltworks do at his request make known that his removal has been determined on by us because we have considered that the salary which he has heretofore received is too high. We further make known that the said removal has not been at his request that he has expressed his willingness to remain during the period mentioned in the last Will and Testament of William King and to entitle him to the legacy of ten thousand dollars therein mentioned and we do hereby agree as far as we are interested that he has performed the condition on which he was to receive the said legacy.
