This Indenture made the seventeenth day of August in the Year of Our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty four Between Mary Viney of Washington County of the one part and William Beattie of the same place Witnesseth that the said Mary Viney doth hereby voluntarily put her daughter Dinella aged four Years the 10th of March last past Apprentice to the said William Beattie to serve him and his Assigns until she shall arrive to the full age of eighteen Years - during all which time the said Dinella her said Master faithfully shall serve according to her power wit and ability - In consideration whereof the said William Beattie is hereby obliged to find and provide for the said Apprentice meat, drink, washing lodging & apparel fitting for an Apprentice during the above term as also to teach, or cause to be taught and instructed to read the holy Scriptures. And at the end of her Apprenticeship to give unto the said Apprentice such freedom dues as is allowed to servants imported into this Country without Wages.
