unto Cinnamon the one two several Tracts of Land being part of Two thousand eight hundred acres
formerly bought by the said James Wood the said being in the said County of Washington on the
a branch of the Potomac River — hereby ratifying and confirming whatever our said Attorney shall do, or cause to be

This Indenture Witnesseth that Robert Daniel Pierce Son of Daniel Pierce deceased is fully
Owner of Court of Washington County. Appointed to William State Washington to learn his Art or Mystery, and in
himself the manner of an Apprentice to serve from the day of the date hereof until he is the age of Twenty one
Years, during which time, the said Apprentice his Master faithfully shall serve, his debts keep, and all
his lawful commands every where gladly obey, he shall do no damage to his Master, nor use it to be done by
others without letting or giving notice thereof to his said Master. He shall not wear any said Master's goods
nor lend them unlawfully to others. He shall not commit Fornication nor contract Matrimony during
his said Term. He shall not play at Cards, Dice, or any other unlawful game whereby his said
Master may be damaged with his own goods of others. He shall not absent himself away or longer
from his said Master's Service unlawfully, nor absent himself to any place of any kind, but in all things behave
as a faithful Apprentice ought to do. In the said Master shall provide for his apprentice
meat drink apparel lodging and washing and all his Necessaries during the said Term, and shall
give him such schooling as the law allows Apprentice in such cases, and shall learn him the Art
and Mystery of the Washington Trade, and pay him such freedom dues as the Law allows, And to
the true performance of all and every of the said Covenant and Agreements either of the said Parties
bind themselves to the other jointly by their presents. In Witness whereof we have hereunto
