Washington County & State of Virginia being weak of Body, yet of sound Mind & Memory, thinking the to
God, calling to mind the mortality of the Body, and knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to die,
do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament, that is to say Principally & first of all I give and
recommend my Soul into the Hands of God and as for my Body I recommend it to the earth to be
buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my Executors in hopes of glorious
Resurrection. And as touching such Real Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this
Life I have bequeathed and disposed of the same in the following manner and form. — I order, give
that all just debts & Chancery charges be paid out of the whole Estate. — I Infirmar I leave and bequeath unto
my well beloved Wife Sarah Greer the one third part of my personal Estate that I now possess of together
with a competent support to be given to her or by my real Estate during her Widowhood. — I have I leave
and bequeath unto my son Patrick Greer Ten Penns currency to be paid to him at the expiration of
three Years after my decease. Item I leave and bequeath unto my two sons William and Thomas Greer
the whole remaining part of my Estate both real and personal to be equally divided between them. And I
do further nominate & appoint my two said sons William and Thomas Greer to be whole and sole Executors of
this my last Will and Testament, revoking & disannulling all former Wills and testaments & confirming these
my last Will and Testament. In Witnes whereof I have hereunto set my Hand & Seal this 17th Day of
April 1780.

in Body but perfect in Memory. I do bequeath to my Wife Martha one Negro Woman named
Alice. I do bequeath to my son John one Negro boy named Will, as also the Warrant
for Land from Brebbon to my son John, And to collect my Debts here on Helson to
pay the said Marvant and clear off all Debts. I bequeath to my son John and
Samuel the Bonds due from John Helson the State 75 & 76 half to each equally
divided and to my Wife the 73 Bond. And to my sons Andrew and Robert the
Bond dated 79 equally divided, The Wagon equally divided between my sons
John and Samuel by John also my stock of Cows & Horses to be equally divided between
my Wife and son John, also my Household furniture I leave to my Wife. I also
appoint Samuel Edmondson and Thomas Wilson to be the Executors of this my last
Will & Testament. In Witness my Hand this Twentieth Day of October

In the Name of God Amen. I Moses Trimble of the County of Washington
and State of Virginia being of sound and disposing mind do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament in
the Name of Jesus Christ (Viz) In the first place to collect and receive from my Debts which is due
to me in Rockbridge County, likewise one hundred & thirty pounds lying in the hands of Rockbridge and which I have
the said Moses is to pay the moiety of fifteen pounds to my loving Wife and likewise fifteen pounds to my Daughter
Jem as soon as he collects the said Money. I bequeath likewise to my son Moses his bed and furniture. I likewise
bequeath to my loving Wife her bed & furniture. I likewise bequeath to my Daughter Jane her bed & furniture likewise one
hundred pounds and two dozens and the half of the small powder. And likewise half of the small powder and all my
Plantation utensils I bequeath to my son Moses. I bequeath to my Daughter Jane a white horse and her saddle and her cart
and two cows. I likewise give with to my son Thomas Cloth to make him a suit of Clothes. And likewise I bequeath to my
Wife one Cow and one pig and the remainder of the Household furniture, which furniture of her Decence is to be
equally divided between Moses and Jane my son & Daughter. I likewise bequeath to my son James the said Cow
he on and my great Cow and my Hat. And lastly I do make and constitute my son Moses & George Edgar for
my Executors. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this Twentieth Day of January
in the Year of our Lord Christ One thousand seven hundred and Eighty three.
