Imprimus— all my debts which are but few & none of magnitude are to be punctually and speedily paid, and unto the selling of

In the name of God Amen I Outrick Gratur being of sound mind and memory, thanks be to God for the same, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, in manner and form following to wit.

First, I will that my body be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my executors hereafter named.

Item, I give and bequeath to my sons, Henry and John Gratur all my lands, to be equally divided between them according to quantity and quality to them and their heirs forever - I also request of them to live together as long as they conveniently can in a peaceable and friendly manner.

Item, I will that the balance of my estate be sold at public vendue on a credit of one year, and that the money arising from the sale thereof, together with the money that is now due me, be equally divided amongst my six daughters hereafter named - that is to say Dordtha Langhewiller, Susanna Armstrong, Barbara Cannon, Mary Anderson Catharine Gibson & Henry Gratur.

Lastly I nominate and appoint my sons Henry and John Gratur executors of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former will or wills by me made, and declaring this to be my last will and testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal, this 22^d day of February 1807.
