In the Name of God Amen, I Patrick Drury
of Washington County being weak in body but of sound
and perfect mind and memory do make and publish
this my last Will and Testament in manner following
Viz, first I recommend my soul to God who gave it
and my body to the dust from whence it was taken
to be there after death buried in a Christian like
manner at the direction of my executors hereafter
named. I leave and bequeath to my well beloved
wife Elizabeth Drury all my moveable property to
be by her applied and disposed as she thinks
fit. I leave and bequeath to my daughter Isaac
Smith one dollar. I leave and bequeath to my
daughter Nancy Glenn one dollar. My Land
and houses with the appurtenances thereto
belonging I leave and devise to my two sons

Alexander and James Denny to be by them equally divided as they may agree after the death of their mother provided they both come and live on the same and equally provide for the sustenance and comfort of their mother during her natural life. Should James not think fit to come and live on the Land and administer his part to the support of his mother, then I will that Alexander have the whole of the Land and pay James sixty pounds in property valued at estate Rate one year after the death of their mother. I hereby appoint James Logan and John Stewart executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 14th day of August in the year of our Lord 1797.

At a Court held for Washington County the 19th day of Dec^r 1797 This last Will and Testament of Patrick Denny dec^d was exhibited into Court and proven by the oath of John Holliday and James Smith two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And James Logan and John Stewart the executors therein named refusing to undertake the executorship on the motion of Elizabeth Denny wife of the said Patrick Denny dec^d who made oath to the said Will according to Law and together with Edward Crawford her security entered into and acknowledged their bonds in the sum of five hundred Dollars conditioned as the Law directs, a certificate is therefore granted the said Elizabeth for the administration of the said estate with the Will annexed in due form.
