

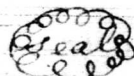
Know all men by these presents that I Preston Hurston of the County of Washington in the State of Virginia have bargained & sold unto John Whitesale of the said County & Sta for the sum & consideration of thirty dollars in hand paid the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged one sorrel horse the years old with a bald face one pided cow & bridled calf being the same cow that the said Hurston purchased of John Teater which I do hereby warrant & defend to the said John Whitesale from the claim or claims of all persons whatsoever now the meaning & intent of the above bill of sale is this that whereas the said John Whitesale did pay unto the said Preston Hurston thirty dollars in a horse for to clear him seven acres of land that is to say grub chop & pick the brush at or ~~upon~~ ^{upon} the first day of March last past which he failed to do & now the said Whitesale has given him untill the ~~fifteenth~~ ^{15th} day of ~~April~~ ^{April} to perform & do the s^d work according to his bargain then this Bill of sales is void & if not to continue in full force & virtue. Given under my hand & seal this 29th day of June 1870.
