 Born in the Year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred
 and seventy six September fifteenth apprentice to s.^d Martin
 Gash to serve him or his assigns from the day of the date
 hereof for and during the Term Prescribed by law and do by
 these presents Covenant that the s.^d Sarah Sharp shall
 well and truly serve her s.^d Master or his Lawfull assigns
 for and during the s.^d time According to the laws and custom
 of this State and the s.^d Master for him self his heirs
 and assigns in Consideration thereof Doth hereby Covenant
