Thence from said Not North crossing the spur of the same, and Paint Lick mountain the North fork of Clinch by John Hines plantation, and over the river ridge by James Roises in the Baptist walk to a Sugar tree and two white Oaks on the head of Sandy five Miles one quarter twenty poles.

Then Beginning at said Walnut and Buckeye above the Royal Oak and running South crossing the Middle fork of Holstein Campbells mill creek three mountains, the South fork of Holstein above Jones's Mill, his mill creek four Mountains and Fox creek to six white Pipes on the top of the Iron mountain by a Laurel thicket, Eleven miles three quarters and sixty Poles. The distance of said line from the head of Sandy to the top of the Iron mountain is thirty three miles.
