 men once to die Do make and Ordain this my last Will and
 Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and
 recommend my soul into the hand of Almighty God that gave
 it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a
 decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing
 doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again
 by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate which
 hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give
 devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form
 First I give and bequeath to Betheiah my beloved wife and my
 son William Logan all my household goods debts and moveable effects
 to their whole and sole use during their life and at their
 death what may remain shall revert to my son James Logan
 and his heirs forever - Likewise I give and bequeath to John
 Kinkead my son-in-law Ten shillings to be levied of the whole
 Estate I do Likewise appoint my son James Logan Executor of
 this my last Will and Testament I Likewise disannul all
 and every other former Will Legacies Requests and bequests by
 me in any Will before named willed or bequeathed ratifying
 this and no other to be my last Will and Testament
 In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the
 sixteenth day of October Seventeen hundred and eighty
 seven
