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commit my soul to God who gave it me and my body to the Earth
to be buried in a Christian way and manner at the discretion of
my executors, Nothing doubting but at the Resurrection of the dead
I shall receive the same again, and as touching what worldly
things it hath pleased God to bless me with I leave and
bequeath in the following way and manner, Viz, I leave to my
well beloved wife Margaret all her bed and bed clothes
wheels and reels to be disposed of at her death and at her pleasure:
likewise I leave her a sufficient maintainance of meet drink wash-
ing and lodging of the place during her natural life. likewise
I give to my son James five pounds in trade. I give and bequeath
to my son William five pounds in trade. likewise I give to my
son Samuel five pounds in trade. and to my son John I leave five
pounds in trade. and all the rest of my Estate real and personal
I give and bequeath to my son Robert. And I appoint my son
William and my son John Duff to be my Executors and I
do acknowledge this to be my last Will and Testament revoking
and former Will that have been made by me. In witness whereof
I have set my hands and seal this ninth day of December 1796
signed, sealed and pronounced in presence of us.
