first I bequeath to my Executors and the survivor of them his Executors and  
Administrators all my real and personal property after discharging  
all just debts & demands against me, in trust, nevertheless to place  
the same at Interest & to pay one fourth of the Interest thereof

coming due annually to Catherine Eliza during her natural life  
time, the other three fourths of the interest coming due an-  
nually to be appropriated by my said executors &c for the use & benefit  
of my three children, in educating, boarding, cloathing & every thing  
necessary, for their comfort both Sarah Eliza and John Glen the  
children of the said Catherine Myers. — Secondly on the decease  
of the said Catherine Myers, it is my intent and desire that the whole  
of my property Real and Personal shall be equally divided by my said  
Executors &c amongst my said three children that is to be divided  
between them on their becoming of Age, or the girls being married

with the consent and approbation of my said Executors &c. I appoint  
Stephen Trigg & John Woods both of the Mississippi Territory executors  
of this my testament & last will. In witness whereof I have hereto  
set my hand & seal this 11<sup>th</sup> day of October in the year of our lord  
one Thousand eight hundred & nine

to dispose of all & singular the said Goods & Chattels, rights & Credits  
according to the true intent & meaning of the testator aforesaid  
hereby requiring them to exhibit into the office of the Register of the  
Court, a true & perfect Inventory of the said Goods & Chattels, right  
& Credits, and to render an account of their said administration, con-  
formably to the condition of their bond entered into this day.

Know all men by these presents, That I John Irvin senior of the County of Fayette & State of Kentucky have constituted & by these presents do constitute & appoint John Irvin junior my true & lawful Attorney in fact, for me & in my name, to conduct and prosecute a suit commenced for my benefit by Jacob Irvine (since deceased) against James Campbell on a bond for a negro man & woman & their issue (if any) in the Court of Washington County, State of Virginia giving & granting unto my said Attorney, full power & authority, to use, & take all lawful ways & means for the recovery thereof, & upon the receipt of any such debts, dues or sums of money aforesaid, acquittances or other sufficient discharge for me & in my name to make & deliver, & generally all & every other act or acts whatever necessary to be done in the premises to execute & perform, as fully & completely to all intents & purposes as I might or could do if I were personally present, or as if the business required a more special authority than is herein given; & if necessary, one or more attorneys under him for the purpose aforesaid, to constitute, & appoint, & again at pleasure to revoke, hereby ratifying & confirming whatever my said Attorney shall lawfully do in the premises by virtue of these presents.
