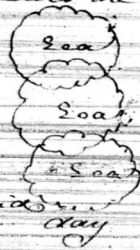


We whose names are herunto subscribed being appointed by the County Court of Washington to lay off and assign to Amelia Grubbs late widow of Samuel Mock deceased One full and equal third part of all the lands tenements and other real estate whereof the said Samuel Mock on any then to his use was seized of an estate of inheritance at the time of his death do report as followeth to wit, The line bounding the lands to which the said Amelia is entitled shall begin in the middle of the great road where the Beginning line of the land on which the said Samuel Mock deceased crosses the said road thence North fourteen degrees West to a large whiteoak N13° E 98 poles to a spanish oak and whiteoak N70° W 68 poles to a walnut and Honey Louises Lomen and with this line W 28 poles to a poplar sapling on the side of a brushy ridge N60 W 58 poles to two whiteoak saplings supposed to be in the line S 39° E 64 poles to a pine oak E 41 poles to the middle of the great road east of the house S 9 poles to the middle of the branch and up the same to the corner of the road thereof and from the center of the spring 55 poles on a direct line to the Beginning corner of the survey thence a north line to the center of the said road and with it to the Beginning. We also allow said Amelia a pass way opposite the present dwelling house so that she may enjoy her part of the spring which way shall not exceed six feet wide and shall not injure any of the fruit trees. In testimony whereof we have herunto set our hands and seals the 23rd day of February 1808.
