I Sarah Dickenson late widow of Cyphey Dickenson of the County of Washington & State of Virginia being of perfect mind & memory thanks be to God and knowing that it is appointed for me once to Die and being now in full & peaceable possession of my part of the Estate with which it was please God to bless my husband in his life time - After Recommending my soul in to the hand of almighty God. I do dispose of the said property in the following manner & form - that is to say to two of my Children that has supported me in my Derolation & weaknes I divide my Property thus I give & bequest to my son John Dickenson the following slave to wit Dask & her increase to him & his Bodily heirs forever - to my daughter Nancy Dickenson I give an other slave to wit daff & her Increase to her & her heirs forever I do also my other property of what name to ever to be Divided amongst them at my Decease - & it is my will & desire, that if either of my two Children should decease having no lawful heirs from the Body - that is to say John or Nancy Dickenson the property of the Deceased, shall be the right of the surviving - John or Nancy Dickenson - whom in joint partnership I make & ordain the soul executors of this my last Will & Testament Ratifying & confirming this to be my last Will & Testament. In Witness whereof I hereunto set my hand & seal this tenth Day of December In the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & seven -

Pursuant to an Order of the Court of Washington County bearing date the 20th day of December 1808 we John Campbell sen^r. James Bradley & David Campbell three of the persons named in the said order have assigned & do hereby appportion & assign to M^{rs}. Mary King widow of William King dec^d. the following slaves to wit, Fin a mulatto man slave aged twenty eight years, Betty a negro woman aged forty five years, Daniel a negro boy aged eight years Alexander aged twenty two years, Samuel aged twenty four years James aged ten years, Polly aged sixteen years, Nelson aged eight years, Patty aged eight years, Rebecca aged six years & Aggy aged ten years being her share of the slaves whereof the said William King died possessed in his own right as produced to us. Given under our hands this 29th day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & eight.

At a Court held for Washington County the 16th day of May 1810.

This assignment of dower to Mary King in the slaves of William King dec^d. made by John Campbell & others pursuant to an Order of the Court of this County was returned to Court & ordered to be recorded.
