

This Indenture

made the 19th. day of March 1723. Between Simon Frost of the one Part and Nathan Nicholas of the other Part, Witnesseth that the said Nathan Nicholas by the Order of the Court of Washington County is put Apprentice to Simon Frost, to learn the Art and Mystery of a Weaver, and with him after the manner of an Apprentice to stay and serve until he arrives at the Age of Twenty one Years, which Term will expire upon the 19th day of June in the Year 1747. And the said Frost is to teach or cause to be taught the said Apprentice to read and write, and to find him in meat drink washing lodging and clothing fit for such an Apprentice, and to give him a Shove and saddle of the value of Ten pounds and a Suit of Cloathes at the expiration of the said Term. In Witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands and Seals the 19th. day of March 1723.

This Indenture

Witnesseth that Abraham Cain Son of Barbara Cain of the County of Washington and State of Virginia doth put himself Apprentice to John Cakes of the County of State aforesaid (Blacksmith) to learn his Art or Mystery, and with him after the manner of an Apprentice to serve from the Day of the Date hereof, for and during the Term of five Years next ensuing. During all which Term the said Apprentice his said Master faithfully shall serve, his secrets keep, and all his Lawful commands every where gladly obey. He shall do no Damage to his said Master nor see it to be done by others, without telling or giving notice thereof to his said Master. He shall not waste his Masters goods nor lend them unlawfully to others. He shall not commit Fornication nor contract Matrimony during the said Term. He shall not play at Cards Dice or any other unlawful game whereby his Master may be damaged with his Goods or the goods of others. He shall not absent himself Day or Night from his said Masters Service unlawfully, nor haunt Ale houses, Taverns or Play houses but in all things behave himself as a faithful Apprentice in the Trade or Mystery he now followeth. And the said Master shall provide and provide for him sufficient meat drink lodging apparel washing and all other necessaries during said Term, and also to give the said Apprentice four Months Schooling within the said Term and at the expiration of said Term to give said Apprentice his freedom. Since Day One full new Suit of Cloathes besides his wearing Apparel, also a full set of Shewing Coles, a hammer & Tongs, And for the true Performance of all and every the above Commands and Agreements, either of the Parties doth bind himself unto the other by their parents. In Witness whereof they have hereunto interchangeably set their Hands & Seals this Twenty third Day of August in the Year of our Said Lord One thousand seven hundred and thirty three.
